The Church of Christ, in Every Age

On Sunday, July 21 Pastor Rob chose a wonderful hymn found on page 589 of the UMC Hymnal. The words of *The Church of Christ, In Every Age* were very powerful and drove a message to many hearts of those attending. I thought I'd reprint the five verses of this hymn that drove that message loud and clear of why CUMC is located at 1011 Second Street. The church is here not only "to create safe spaces for growth and community in Christ", but to be the example for others of what a church should BE...we are meant to be the servants in our community showing others we care. *We must never forget that*.

- 1. The church of Christ, in every age beset by change but Spirit led, must claim and test its heritage and keep on rising from the dead.
- 2. Across the world, across the street, the victims of injustice cry for shelter and for bread to eat, and never live until they die.
- 3. Then let the servant church arise, a caring church that longs to be a partner in Christ's sacrifice, and clothed in Christ's humanity.
- 4. For he alone, whose blood was shed, can cure the fever in our blood, and teach us how to share our bread and feed the starving multitude.
- 5. We have no mission but to <u>serve in full obedience to our Lord</u>, to care for all, without reserve, and spread his liberating word.

This group was in full obedience while volunteering this month at Kids' Food Basket.
